Don not only spoke about baseball, but also his time as owner of Hugo's Deli in Victorville, a real estate agent and the Don Ferrarese Children's Foundation.

Don has had four careers in his lifetime. He was the owner of Hugo's Deli for 22 years, a Major League ball player for 15 years, a real estate agents for 33 years and during all of that time he has been a baseball coach for 53 years.

Born in Oakland in 1929. Don was a Major League Baseball pitcher who played from 1955 to 1962 with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, Chicago White Sox, Philadelphia Phillies and St. Louis Cardinals. He holds three records baseball.


First, he walked 209 men in one season, then in the San Antonio Texas League, he pitched four consecutive shut outs and finally, is tied with Babe Ruth for hitting three doubles in one game.

One of the great stories Don shared was the family business of Hugo's Deli in Victorville. One day he came in the restaurant and a man was very upset as he had been waiting for his Pumpernickel, Cream Cheese and Ham sandwich for 45 minutes. Don went to the kitchen to get it right way, but even after serving it to the table, the man still complained and continued to berate Don and his staff. When the man tried to finally eat the sandwich, Don grabbed him by the arm and said, "I don't want you to eat MY food" and threw him out! The man outside, getting into his Rolls Royce, said, "I'll own this place by the end of the day!", Don responded with, "Good, I don't want it anymore!"

Nowadays, Don is the name behind the Don Ferrarese Charitable Foundation, started by ten friends who each put in \$10,000 to start the non profit. Going into their 13th year, they have awarded \$4,000 scholarships to 132 students,

through different fundraising events that take place throughout the year.

Don has a biography entitled "Bigger Leagues...Bigger Hearts" which tells more than what he was able to share in his time with us. You can pick it up for \$24.95 and find more information about

This week our President **Dwight Johnson** did some final housekeeping of 2017 by announcing the Rotarian of the month for the final quarter of the year.




