A Journey Through the Mojave Desert

At the first Rotary meeting of 2017, we were introduced to **Col. Scott Taylor**, the Commander, or as he puts it, the "*Mayor and City Manager*" of Ft. Irwin Training Center.

Col. Taylor is in charge of the whole area that has a land mass the size of Rhode Island with 5,000 soldiers in training, staff, military families and civilian employees make up this self sustaining city.

The Ft. Irwin Training Center has the most sophisticated technology available today to our troops. Col. Taylor

compares it to the largest game of Laser Tag. Every maneuver is recorded, so they can play them back and compare.

At the Training Center, military personnel receive the toughest training available.

Col. Scott Taylor says that if deployment is the "Super Bowl", then Ft. Irwin is the final playoff game before it.

They try and create

the most accurate training environment, so there is less of a shock when a solider is deployed to a region.

Even though the Center is located in the desert, there are realistic set ups for mountains and hillsides, as a lot of current training is being adapted for an country like North Korea.



They know that they may have to fight in cities someday, not open terrain, so a city has been created to handle this type of urban warfare training.

Ft. Irwin is also a town within itself, for the military and their families. The area includes housing, four schools, The Exchange, a full shopping center, complete with their own WalMart and Game Stop, parks, gyms and restaurants including fast food and much more. Col. Taylor referred to the living area of Ft. Irwin as an extremely large gated community.

Recognizing Veterans is very important to Col. Scott Taylor and on Saturday, February 11 they will be holding a Vietnam Veterans Recognition event complete with a parade, big gala dinner and a concert. They are in discussions at the moment to get the classic rock band Blue Oyster Cult to perform, which will be a huge draw. To stay up to date on this event and more about the Ft.
