### The Evolution of Hospitals.

As far back as any of us can recall, when we have needed medical attention, there has been a hospital nearby, full of trained doctors, nurses and staff to handle any situation. But hearing from **Dr. Riad Abdelkarim**, the Chief Medical Officer at St Joseph Health/St. Mary, it took many centuries to reach what we expect from hospitals today.

The evolution of hospitals stretches as far back as 2,500 years, where in ancient cultures, both religion and medicine were closely linked. The earliest documentation of institutions providing cures were performed in ancient Egyptian temples. In Greece, temples were dedicated to the healer god of Asclepius that would function as a center for medical advice,

prognosis and healing. In fact there are three

large marble boards dated around 350 BC that preserved the names, case histories, complaints and cures for about 70 patients who came to the temple to be

cured.

Around 100 BC in the Roman Empire, buildings were erected called Valetudinaria that took care of sick slaves, gladiators and soldiers. Although there are no records for these early hospitals, many have been identified through archeology due to their specific layout.

Between the 8th-15th centuries, the Islamic Medieval Age saw numerous advances in science as scholars gathered knowledge from across the known world and added their own findings. The biggest contribution from this time period was the establishment of hospitals, that were paid for by charitable donations, known as a Zakat Tax.

Over in Europe, medieval hospitals were run by religious communities where the sick were cared for by monks and nuns. In France these hospitals were called "Hotel-Dieu", which translates to 'Hostel of God". Some of these hospitals were fully functional, and others were founded for specific purposes such as leprosy, refuges for the poor and more.

The first Spanish hospital was founded by Catholic Bishop Masona in 580 AD and served as an inn for pilgrim travelers as well as a hospital for citizens and local farmers.

The evolution of hospitals continued for more centuries through the Age of Enlightenment and more through to eventually the United States, where prior to the 1800's there

were very few hospitals in the US. Since the 1900's, the role of hospitals in our country has become central with the US leading in advancements through Industry, education, and technology.
