How to Manage a Plane

If you have \$400 million just laying around you can own a Boeing 777! If that doesn't fit into your budget, then you can always lease one for about \$6 million a month. This week Rotarian and President of ComAV **Craig Garrick** shared with members that these costs, is the reason why private companies rarely own planes anymore.

Years ago, if a company wanted a plane they would put 20% down, finance the rest with a bank and then fly it. With



increased costs and technology, a majority of airplanes are now leased to airlines. Most of the owners are banks, life insurance companies and other financial institutions. One rare exception is FedEx, who purchase their planes out of their own cash flow.

For the last 20 years, ComAV works with these financial

institutions to manage the planes for these airlines. ComAV is made up of two companies, ComAV Technical Services and their Asset Management division.



The Technical Services division is an FAA and EASA certified aircraft and engine storage facility, maintenance, and end of life airframe disassembly. A company like FedEx uses varied quantities of planes during different parts of the year, and Com AV is where the extra planes are kept in storage until they are leased back in the air.

The Asset Management division specializes in upgrading planes to maximize their worth for the companies to get them back in circulation, whether to sell, lease or release.

Education is an area that ComAV is extremely passionate about. During the last 19 years they have offered aviation pathway tours, apprenticeship programs and community efforts, giving back by working very closely with Victor Valley College and their Foundation.

ComAV are the largest continuous employer at SCLA, employing over 300 full and part time employees, with an increase in staff and mechanics coming this year. On top of that they provide over \$45 million economic benefits to the High Desert, along with an estimated over \$250 million indirect benefits.


