

Return to the Hide and Seek River

This week we continued to follow the path of the Hide and Seek River with **Tony Winkel**, Senior Hydro-Geologist with the Mojave Water Agency.

Our journey began on January 17th beginning with the Mojave River Forks, through Spring Valley, Rancho Verde (Kemper Campbell Ranch), Huntington's Station (Old Town Victorville), Oro Grande and up to where we began this week, the Grapevine Station which became Barstow. Originally called Grapevine Station, then Waterman (after the Waterman Mines, and then finally Barstow after railroad tycoon William Barstow Strong. In the early 1900's when a lot of water flowed through the area, it made the region a perfect spot for a railroad yard. Have you ever driven up

Invocation: Flag Salute: 4-Way Test: Song: Van Young Mark Taylor Jon Schuler Al Castellucci houses built in the middle of the desert with nothing around and wondered, "Why would anyone build a house there"? Tony provided us the answer. In 1938, there was a great flood in the valley that wiped out a good portion of the vegetation and brought forth sand along the Mojave River and destroyed communities, and just a few of those landmarks of history still stand today.

A great example of this is Hawley Station near Minneola. In 1885, Hawley offered sports, a dancing pavilion, shade trees, and green fields along the River, now a desert wasteland, wiped away by the 1938 flood.

Our next stop was Camp Cady, which was an Army Camp built in 1860 to protect against Indian attacks. There are still a few homes built along this area.

Four miles down from Camp Cady is the next location, appropriately titled the 4 Mile Water. There was once some surface water there, due to the large clay bedding and still keeps some vegetation to this day. Another mini oasis lies 9 miles from Camp Cady is called, you guessed it, 9 Mile Water. Due to major fault lines, it creates a condition that brings water close to the surface for vegetation to grow.

Our final stops along the Mojave River are Afton Canyon and Cave's Station. The Cave's Station is very unique because there were three caves where pioneers would stop on the trail along the River and use for covering for their wagons. One cave still exist today for visitors.

You can tell **Tony Winke**l has a great passion for water and he shared some great history this month with us on the Hide and Seek River.
