With so many new tax laws for 2018, it took three Rotarians to help us to understand how they will affect us, not only as business owners, but also as employees and individuals.

Moderated by **Dan Dever** from H&R Block.

panelists consisted of John Hulterstrom, CPA and Donna Wells, CPA, to share their knowledge with some of the new laws and fielded questions from the packed room. The new tax law, called the "Tax Cuts and Jobs Act" is the largest federal tax law change in over 30 years.

For employees, work deductions will not be allowed anymore so please make sure you are reimbursed through your employer for any work expenses you have paid for on your own.

In the individual area, the standard deduction will he essentially doubled, from \$6,350 for individuals to \$12,000, and from \$12,700 for married couples jointly to \$24,000. You won't see this change until you file your taxes in April 2019.

On the other side, alimony will not be able to be used as a deductible or as a source of income in 2018, and itemized deductions for home equity interest will no longer be allowed.

When it time came for audience questions, Mike Page asked what everyone was thinking,



no matter what side of the political spectrum you are on, are these new tax laws a good or bad thing? The overall response from our panelists was both good and bad. In a final word moderator **Dan Dever** shared that for businesses the tax law is good, and for "Middle America", those making \$100,000 or less should get a nice return on their 2018 tax returns. Those who make more will lose, but with a good tax professional, shouldn't notice much of a change.
