

## April 8, 2025 A FACILITIES UPDATE FROM THE VESD

This week the Club heard from **Collin Rowe**, who serves as the Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services for the Victor Elementary School District (VESD). In his role, Mr. Rowe serves as the chief business official, managing the financial and operational side of the District while supporting its mission to provide exceptional education for all students.

VESD serves students across 18 schools in four geographic quadrants, including two innovative charter schools. With a clear focus on student success, the District's vision is

to "provide a path to success for all students to define their own futures as lifelong learners." The mission centers on building strong foundational skills through a comprehensive, student-focused approach. True to its motto, VESD is committed to "Learning for all... Whatever it takes!"





Families within each quadrant have the flexibility to choose the school that best fits their child's needs within their zoned area—and also have the option to enroll in one of the District's charter schools. To support this, VESD offers free transportation to any school within a student's quadrant, removing barriers to access and choice.

VESD values community feedback, using the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) to directly shape decisions. A key example: thanks to stakeholder input, shade structures are now either

completed or under construction across all campuses.

Whenever a new addition is made—like the recently opened playgrounds at Green Tree East, Discovery School of the Arts, and Park View Elementary—VESD hosts celebratory "Grand Opening" events complete with ribbon cuttings, making it a special moment for students and staff.

Playground upgrades are prioritized at schools with fewer recess activities, ensuring equitable playtime opportunities throughout the District.

VESD takes pride in maintaining and upgrading its facilities through smart budgeting and grant funding. Recent HVAC and ductwork improvements at Irwin Academy were made possible by the ESSER Grant
