Jay began by sharing a few of the



by the California Senate. First off, Jay wanted to let everyone in the room know that he voted an emphatic "NO" on this Bill.

Jay Obernolte truly feels that this Bill will have lasting damage to residents of

California. Jay voted no on the Bill for a couple of reasons. First, he felt that he could not tell his constituents that the gas tax increase would 100% go to the Transportation Fund and road improvements, when he knows it actually won't. Over and over again Jay has seen money that has supposed to go to road improvements, go into the General Fund instead.

The other reason Jay voted no is that he believes that it will drive more Californians into poverty. The gas tax will increase by 20¢ a gallon and a whopping 25¢ for Diesel! Sadly, it won't stop there. Vehicle registration will also go up in price. Costs will go from \$25 for an older car, to an incredible \$175 for cars worth \$60,000 or more. Most people in California need to commute to make ends meet, and this will cause big damage over the long run because there is no sunset on the tax and it will continue to go up year after year as inflation rises in the State.

Finally, **Jay Obernolte** wanted to wrap up with a positive message. Even though he can't win every battle, his only mission is to represent all of his constituents in the 33rd District to the State of California, and we in the Club are proud to have Jay fighting for us.

many Bills he authored or helped author last year, that have now been passed and signed by Governor Brown. One such Bill will allow the Victor Valley Reclamation Water District to become energy neutral by installing solar, when it was unable in the past due to regulations. This Bill will save Victor Valley residents \$400,000 a year!

Another Bill that made it past the Governor's desk was for the motorcycle riders of California. When a motorist gets a ticket, they have the opportunity to attend traffic school, and have the infraction erased from their record. The same opportunity was not offered to motorcycle riders, until Jay Obernolte got involved.
