We heard from **Andrew Bird**, who attended this year on a scholarship. Andrew shared that going to India was a once in a lifetime chance and was changed him profoundly. He had his own "Rotary Moment", when he learned more about himself and his value system, than at any other time in his life.

Linda Bertuzzi learned that the people of India, no matter religion and beliefs, are full of love and hospitality. In her early days of these trips, there was a lot of talk about 9/11 and a fear of Muslims, but she was able to witness Muslims, Hindu's and Christians all working together to make this world a better place. Paul shared how just like Joseph being sold into slavery and put in prison by the hands of his own brothers but was blessed and risen up by God, so would these people, who have been shamed from society, but are now in a place of love and acceptance and have the hope that God will restore them to their place in their land.

Mark Taylor then took the time to auction off the spoon for 5 weeks in May. Pastor Paul started the bidding at \$50, and then Van Young countered with a \$75 bid. Van thought that the Spoon should go for at least \$100 and changed his bid to that amount and won it for the month of May!
