Reading to Help Reclaim Lost Childhoods

Jane Guttman is a teacher librarian for Juvenile Court Schools in the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools' Office of Education. She champions incarcerated youth at risk and devotes her professional life to advancing correctional education reform and bringing educational equity to imprisoned youth. She seeks to awaken the reader within each juvenile offender, hoping to interrupt the generational tragedy of literacy poverty. Jane envisions a world in which every child can transform a lost childhood into a positive adulthood through access to education.

Jane shared stories of some of the hardships her students have faced leading to their incarceration, including physical and emotional abuse and neglect, parental incarceration, poverty, domestic violence, homelessness, substance abuse issues and parental mental health problems, to name a few. Her goal is to reverse the high risk youth "community" of her students by offering books to those behind bars. Jane encourages adults to mentor these unfortunate young people to change their lives by exposing them to a different community (through books) than the one they grew up in.
