

What Do You Want for Your Parks?

Victorville has been busy collecting data from residents to improve their parks and recreation facilities according to **Janie Lynch**, Recreation Supervisor and Healthy Communities Coordinator for the City of Victorville. As a veteran of over 40 years in municipal recreation, Janie has been with the City of Victorville for 17 years in care of not only



Park and Recs, but also Golf Course Management, Special Event Planning, and the Healthy Communities Initiative for the City.

Over the last 16 years, the population in Victorville has doubled from 64,000 residents to a whopping 120,000. The population growth was just one of the factors what went into the creation of the "Your Opinion Counts" data survey, created to find out such things as what programs residents are participating in and how much time they spend at local parks. Janie's team then analyzed the data to find out what is was needed and where they need to go in the future. Once the study was completed, 7 key findings were addressed.

Finding No. 1: 87% of Victorville residents have visited their local park last year and in that 61% go at least once a month. That is 70,000 going to parks each month, which explains

Finding No. 2: Resident participation is huge at special events like the Fall Festival, but low numbers were found for more structured activities like youth sports and after-school programs.

Finding No. 3: Residents are

mainly looking for the creation of Splash Parks and a new Community Pool.

Finding No.4: Safety is the biggest concerns for residents in terms of their parks. The layout of the park, conditions and lighting are all factors in this but the most important, is the need for more people in the parks. The belief is that the more people who are there, the less that undesirables will want to be.

Finding No. 5: Facilities are being under-utilized. Residents want community centers, gyms and planting gardens. The current plan is to refurbish facilities that residents are not using instead of building new facilities.

Finding No. 6: Marketing in the community is working. 62% of residents are finding out about programs and special events by using the Recreation Books that come in the mail and at City Hall, and 47% are keeping current using social media.

Finding No. 7: Bribery works! The use of prizes such as the opportunity to win big screen TV's and computers for those who filled out the surveys completely, allowed them to get past the minimum number needed to make the survey viable.

Along with these findings are current action items to develop a master-plan in the area of upkeep and new programs, as well as a Park Safety Initiative. Find out more at www.victorvillerec.com.
