just two examples of the LAX \$14 billion modernization program. Its proposed Landside Access Modernization Program would help improve the LAX passenger experience, relieve traffic



congestion and make LAX a world-class airport.

Our speaker this week was **Sheryl L. Thomas-Perkins** who is part of the Government Affairs Division of Los Angeles World Airports. LAX is the third busiest airport and the number one destination airport in the nation. This project will take 7 years to complete, but will cut down airport time there from three hours to one!

Their first step is to create the Automated People Mover System which will allow passengers to get from one side of the airport to another in under 10 minutes! The People

Mover will be an above ground transport system connecting

passengers to airline terminals and more, running over 2 miles in length. There will be six stations connecting passengers with key LAX locations.

The other area in need of



modernization is the rental car facilities. Right now there are

23 different rental car companies located at different areas of the airport. The LAMP project will consolidate them all into one, convenient location making the rental car experience quick and easy. The new center would relocate existing rental car companies into one area by the 405 Freeway with direct connections to the airport using the Automated People Mover.

The next step is for two new transit hubs that would create more convenience for air travelers, providing locations outside the LAX Central Terminal Area for pick up, drop off and parking. The facilities would also offer direct access to terminals with the People Mover, flight check-in, boarding passes and other amenities.

The final part of this project will deal with the addition of more Metro Line public transit opportunities to LAX, roadway improvements and overall design upgrades to the airport.
