The spotlight was shared between our Guest Speaker and (newly acquired) blue badge holder, Brad Letner; our newest Rotarian, Mark McKay's Induction ceremony; and new Club President, Steve Murray's first meeting of his year.

Today's speaker, Brad Letner, gave a special program this week on patriotism and the trends of American citizens' levels of patriotism going back to W.W.II. He was joined by his wife, Teresa, and had a great presentation for Victorville Rotarians, in time for our Independence Day. Brad has an impressive resume within the U.S. Army, and it was obvious what America means to him. His program offered statistics based on trends from the "Greatest Generation", showing a video clip from "Saving Private Ryan" to remind us of that generation's great sacrifice on June 4, 1944, "D-Day". Brad focused on trends in patriotism since that date, up to the "iGeneration" a term coined as that which is the first generation to grow up using

the latest technologies... IPad, IPhone, iMac, etc. These kids have never seen a floppy disk or heard an audio cassette. Brad's desire is for this generation to learn about patriotism, and feels there are three ways to encourage patriotism in our youth: (1) Shape It, (2) Show It, and (3) Share It! Thank you, Brad, for the enlightening presentation.

Past District Governor Stew Anderson performed an "outstanding" induction this week, as usual, inducting Mark McKay into the Rotary Club of Victorville. Stew stressed the eradication of Polio as one of Rotary's biggest challenges in the world. Mark's family joined him in the celebration, as did Sponsor Al Castellucci. Mark's son is a Riverside Club Rotarian, and we are very pleased to have Mark join our Club; he stated his great interest in public service, and feels privileged to be a Rotarian of the Victorville Club, where he can continue to serve.


