

# **Beck Oil: 50 Years of Success**

This week, Rotarians were expecting to hear from member **Corey Beck**, but instead, Corey announced that there would be no one better to speak about the 50th Anniversary of the company than his father and owner of Beck Oil, **Glenn Beck**.

Beck Oil, Inc. was started in 1967 in Victorville by Glenn and Buzz Beck with only two drivers. In 1973 a new office and warehouse was built on Turner Road in Victorville and

only Shell products were sold at that time. In 1974, Carson Oil in Inyokern was purchased, followed by Mitchell Oil in Trona, CA in the 1980's. By 1983, Beck Oil, Inc owned and operated five service stations with convenient stores inside four of them. From there they purchased Victorville Oil, and most recently in January 2008, bought Lee Escher Oil Company in Coachella.

At the present time, they have 65 employees and

The largest aspect of their business is branding. If someone wants to open a service station, Beck Oil will sign them to a 10 year contract and brand them as a Shell, Union 76, Sinclair or BP Station. Although they deliver gas to different competitors, the gas is close, but not the same. Each company adds in their own additives to make their gas unique.

Beck Oil also delivers lubricants and chemicals to different companies. Sadly, this is a dying business according to Glenn, as more synthetic oils are being used nowadays in this industry over classic crude.

They also deliver to smaller dealers who need 200 gallons or less of fuel. Places such as farms and golf courses are just two types of industries that need this exact service.

The fourth aspect to the company is their CardLock (CFN) locations from California to Texas, which allows large fleet companies to have drivers using their cards, unlock pumps from un-manned stations and fuel up with the card recording the gallons used, which is sent in a monthly bill to the company using the service.

Today, Beck Oil operates four commercial CardLock fueling locations along with their brand new Fleet Card office in Apple Valley, which opened in February of this year. In that location they carry several brands of lubricants as well as chemicals, solvents, off road diesel, blends of specialty bio-diesel, racing fuel and all grades of gas.

From 1967 - 2017 Beck Oil has grown into a powerhouse here in the Victor Valley. Congratulations to Glenn, Corey and everyone at Beck Oil for continued success!
