A Buyers Guide to the Residential Real Estate Market

The residential real estate market is on the rise according to Honorary Rotarian and owner of Shear Realty, **Caroll Yule**. Over the past year, median home prices have risen 7% from \$220,000 in July 2016 to \$237,000 in July of this year. The best news is that homes are being purchased just as soon as they are finished being built!

Oak Hills has come in this year with the highest home closing price at an average of \$370,000. This is due to larger homes on vast properties, and also the fact that there 80,000 commuters and it is a perfect place to live for "down the hill" freeway access. Next highest place is Spring Valley Lake (\$278,000), followed by the "Big 3" of Hesperia, Apple Valley and Victorville. Even though Victorville is third in terms of closing prices of the three, they come in first of 28.2% of sales for the whole region, with Apple Valley coming in a close second at 25.4% of sales.

Right now, the High Desert is the only affordable housing left in California. There are very few homes left available in California and because of that prices are through the roof, not only for buyers, but renters as well. Even real estate agents down the hill are trying everything they can to get listings here in the High Desert. At this point there is only a two month supply of inventory locally.

Song: Al Castellucci Finemaster: Mark Taylor For homes sold in the first half of this year, 1,554 homes in the \$200,000 - \$3000,000 were sold and 1,008 in the 100's were bought up by new home owners. In total there have been 3,388 sold this year, with 2,743 of those sales under the \$300,000 mark.

The challenges in the current market are the two "A's", Affordability and Availability. We have already covered the limited available



inventory statewide and locally, but the afforadability is a different challenge altogether. Real estate agents are looking for two types of buyers, Millennials (under 25 years) and new parents (25 - 44). These make up the growing first time home owners. With the median home price of \$237,000 and the average income of a Millennial \$33,626 and new parents \$50,251, it can make a qualifying process a nightmare.

What does the future hold for the residential real estate market? Home sales are expecting to soar in 2018, but, analysts are not predicting anything past next year.
