### What do YOU Know about Zzyzx Road?

Our Club was honored this week to welcome County of San Bernardino Assessor-Recorder and former State Senator **Bob Dutton** with us to speak about the current values in the High Desert as well as some history of the County.

Bob's job is mainly to make sure that property owners in the County are not over assessed and in turn not over taxed. He determines the value of a property and then the Tax

Collector determines the tax. In 2014, when Bob took over the office, a lot the senior staff retired which was good and bad. On the negative side, he lost years of knowledge but on the plus side he was able to rebuild the office on his task of making sure property owners were not overcharged. The 2017 Annual Property Assessment contained

810,304 taxable parcels which were valued at a whopping \$206,576,804,207. The average real estate values in San Bernardino increased by 6.1% and the High Desert region was increased by 5%. In fact, of the 58 counties in California, San Bernardino ranked number 7 in real estate values.

Bob also serves as the Recorder for the County and gave the Club a Clerk update from last year. In 2016, there were 571, 671 documents recorded, over 14,000 fictitious business names were filed, 10,868 marriage licenses issued, and 4,700 marriage ceremonies conducted. On top of that, they also opened a new office in the Joshua Tree District.

In the final part of his presentation Bob discussed his passion - history. The County has a vast library of historical archives and have created a Throwback Thursday video series on their website that highlights local history as a way of preserving and protecting the history of San Bernardino County. Such videos include the story of Helendale, Route 66, and George Air Force Base and more.

One of the highlighted videos shared at our meeting was the history of Zzyzx, CA. The town was originally called Soda Springs, which was a natural spring found 7 miles south of Baker, CA. In 1944 Curtis Howe Springer filed a mining claim for 12,000 acres surrounding the springs. From there he established a health spa and named it Zzyzx, as a marketing tool to say that they were truly the last world in health. In time he built a hotel, a church a radio studio, and airstrip and even a castle, but in the 70's, the federal government discovered he had no legal rights to the land and he was evicted and Zzyzx was reclaimed by the federal government. Today, California State University manages the land in and around Zzyzx. For more information on the County of San Bernardino visit sbcounty.gov.
