provided all the materials for the new Tacoma Narrows Bridge in Washington and the I-90 floating bridge in Seattle.

CalPortland is more than paving roads as they have also done major runways and taxiways for LAX, McCarran Airport in Las Vegas and Edwards Air Force Base. Rail lines are also serviced by the company such as the Los Angeles Metro Rail Gold Line and the Beacon Tunnel in Washington. For the shipping industry, they have provided building material for Port of Los Angeles and the Seal Launch Pier at the Port of Long Beach.

CalPortland also holds a Guinness World Record. A total of 21,200 cubic yards of cement was used to pour the foundation laying for the new Wilshire Grand Center in Los Angeles. This engineering masterwork took 18 hours, with 200 trucks delivering concrete from eight different CalPortland locations. Nineteen separate pumps feeding 13 hoses were used to fill the site with 82 million pounds of concrete!
