#### Leaving Uncle Sam's Plane in the Jungle

Lt. Col. Tony Marshall (USAF-Retired) is an unapologetic and blunt individual, who used mind games and outright lies to survive a 9-month stay in the Hanoi Hilton in Vietnam, before it was fashionable.

Tony always had a love for flying, which began as a child, living near an Air Force Base with his mom. As an adult he joined the Air Force and became part of the 13th Squadron Panther Pack in Thailand and chose to do a tour of Vietnam. As a Weapons Operator on a F4 Fighter Jet, he completed 266 missions and because he followed the rules of combat, he always came home...except one time.

There are three facets to combat flying. Follow the rules, come home safe, and if the bad guy is in your way, shoot him down. When you don't follow these rules, one of three things will happen to you. You will either be fine, get shot down and go to prison, or get shot down and killed.

One July, Tony was flying with a new pilot who did not follow the rules. One of the rules is not to fly below 4500 feet and never fire the gun on the F4, use the bombs instead. This pilot had a target he liked and would continue to go to this location and try to blow up a barge. Unfortunately, once you start doing the predictable, the enemy catches on...quickly. They finally did hit the barge, but the enemy hit them too and all Tony remembers was the explosion, ejection, a white light

and an out of body experience. When he awoke, he was faced with AK47's and the choice to fight or surrender. The pilot chose to fight and was killed, and Tony surrendered and following a 5 mile hike, arrived at the Hanoi Hilton.

Tony had only one fear in his time there, and that was becoming a vegetable. In solitary with no one to talk to, you can lose your mind easily. Instead he made friends and gave names to the rodents in his cell to keep his sanity. He quickly learned the way to keep from being tortured and beaten was to bow. The Vietnamese do not like to lose face, so when told to bow, he did. In fact Lt. Col. Tony Marshall was never beaten because he played a game of wits with them and lied all the time, and told them what they wanted to hear.

He was finally released at the end of the war and now runs the Aviation Program at the Millionaire Mind Kids organization. There he helps kids in the local community to fly and to become pilots and make a positive change on the ground, and above it, in the skies.
