## Water for Future Generations

This week, the Club welcomed Mojave Water Agency General Manager **Tom McCarthy** to speak on the California Water Fix and what it means to the High Desert. The Mojave Water Agency serves 4,000 square miles in San

> Bernardino County, including Barstow, Lucerne Valley, Yucca and the Victor Valley.

> > The California Water Fix is a \$17 billion plan to build two large, four-story tall tunnels to carry fresh water from the Sacramento River under the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta toward the intake stations for the State Water Project and the Central Valley

### **This Week's Functionaries**

Invocation: Flag Salute: 4-Way Test: Song: Finemaster: Bill Edwards Jon Schuler Brad Letner Al Castellucci David North Project. Currently the system is broken, endangering fish habitats like the Delta Smelt, and the current pumping systems actually work in reverse of the natural river flow!

The California Water Fix will create two tunnels, which will then flow through three intake valves, and allow the rivers to flow in natural conditions. The tunnels are 40 ft in diameter at 150ft below the ground and 30 miles long, that would help hold our levees, which are 20 to 30 ft above sea level.

This fix is important to California on many levels. Over 25 million people and thousands of businesses from the Bay Area to San Diego rely on water along the Delta to survive. Over 3 million acres of farmland, located mainly in Central California need this water as well, in addition to the previously mentioned fish and wildlife. The constant challenge of levee failures, rising sea levels and earthquakes in California could harm the ecosystem, and the new system would bypass those risks.

Without the fix there will be a 20% decline in water annually, for over 70 million Californians. In the High Desert, there would be a 27% decline, about 15,000 acre feet. The project is also important to the High Desert for future growth. For large development to occur, a nexus between planned growth and water supply is required by AB221/610.

Mojave Water Agency would fund 2% of the 18 year project to help the High Desert grow, and have a safe and fresh water supply for generations to come.
