The County recently passed with a 2/3 vote, an additional \$1 million to go directly towards public safety, to hire more officers and to make sure that those that need be incarcerated, do exactly that! The days of doing time of 30 days, instead of 3 years for stealing a car, is coming to an end.

They are working with Sheriff's in unincorporated areas, trying to develop a successful Neighborhood Watch program. In a recent area, only 5 of the 65 residents participated, but they are doing community involvement to make sure these residents understand that you do not wait for something to happen, but stop it before it does. They are also growing their Prisoner to Work program, to help young people who do minor crimes, have future outside of the prison system.
