On this week of Thanksgiving, Rotarians will not soon forget the internet hashtags of "**#NoMoreBadDays**" and "**#B Greater**", after hearing the inspiring story of **Brisa Alfaro**, daughter of the iconic Las Brisas Restaurant family of Apple Valley.

Brisa's story began on March 24, 2014 when she was 32 years old. At that time she was a successful nail tech,

not only with her own shop, but sought out by celebrities, industry leaders and more. As a jet setter, she was traveling from New York, to Chicago, back to her home in Santa Monica, and then back to New York for a big hair and nail show. Along with

In her hotel the next morning, it had not cleared up, so a friend suggested she seek immediate help at a hospital in Queens, NY. It was there in the hospital she suffered from Pons Stroke, or a Brain Stem Stroke.

Most strokes happen in the left or right side of the brain, but Brisa's was right down the middle on her brain stem. She describes it was to imagine your brain is a town, and the stem is the only way in and out of that town. This stroke allows no access in or out of the brain! In her coma, she could hear the doctors discussing the good chance that even IF she came out of the coma, that she would never walk or function properly again.

Brisa did come out of her coma, and had no movement from the neck down. Being the fighter that she is, nothing would stop her and in time she was able to move her pinky finger and would, from there, have to proceed to learn as a baby would, how to hold her head up, walk and even learn to breathe and talk on her own again after a tracheotomy surgery. To her, everyday was like running a marathon! Today, she still has to go through surgeries and therapy, but you wouldn't know it by looking at her.

She asked herself one day, "Why Me?" The next thought in her head was, "Why Not Me? What makes me so special?" From that she has learned a whole new outlook on life and teaches others that life is to be cherished, to be grateful and not get bogged down by the little stresses that come along in our daily lives. Just like her doctors, she teaches that when people tell you that you can't succeed...you can.
