Community Service

Food Baskets

Food baskets to the needy at Thanksgiving, Christmas or Easter.

Immunization Project

Less than 72% of our children age two and under are adequately immunized. Referral phone line and postcard reminders to families regarding immunizations due.

City Partnership Projects

City and Community organization collaboration matching grants for Victor Valley Rescue Mission.

Gifts for Kids

At Christmas we adopt "Angels" and fulfill their wishes for the Angel Tree (Clothing and Toys).

Youth Service

Junior Rotary Clubs School

Students at High, Junior High and Elementary Schools develop service projects and fund raisers as well as working on their leadership skills.

Rotaract

A Professional Development, Fellowship and Service oriented Club for young business and professional people located at Victor Valley College.

Teen Leadership Camp for 8th Graders

3-day leadership camp that stresses "leading yourself" as a first step to leading others.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) for Juniors in High School.

A 3-day leadership camp that develops abilities in an atmosphere of fellowship and learning.

Gerard Brown "Read to Me" Program

Business people read to kindergartners at a local school and talk about their business or profession.

Literacy

Rotarians and Interactor read books to children and give them their own copy.

Vocational Service

Teachers' Mini-Grants

Money is given to teachers for innovative projects to increase the students chances to complete school and LEARN.

High School Scholarships

Students going further: basics, service, financial need, goals and GPA.

College Scholarships

For continuing students at Victor Valley College.

4-Way Speech Contest-from Club to District

High school students incorporate the 4-Way Test in a speech they develop and present at a club meeting.

Dr. Pat Mark Junior High 4-Way Speech Contest

Junior High School students incorporate the 4-Way Test in a speech presented at a club meeting.

Dr. Dale Marsden Elementary 4-Way Speech Contest

Elementary school students incorporate the 4-Way Test in a speech presented at a club meeting.

Dan Stover Music Awards-from Club to District

Individual performance, music contest.

S.T.A.R. Awards "Striving To Achieve Results"

6th grader with a G.P.A. of 3.5 or less for a significant improvement in G.P.A., attendance and/or attitude.

Brentwood Career Exploration

2nd and 3rd grade students have lunch with a Rotarian and explore the relevant career.

George Hensel Ethics Essay Contest

A \$3,000 District competition endowed by Rotarian George Hensel.

International Service

Ensenada Orphanage

Christmas baskets. Electric bills paid and food donated.

International Youth Exchange - Summer

High school students spend three weeks in a foreign country and then return with the foreign student for three weeks here.

International Youth Exchange - Year

Juniors or Seniors spend an academic year in the foreign country of their choice. We adopt students from other countries for their academic year here, 3-6 month per family.

Sister Club - Ensenada

Fellowship, skills and aid are shared with selected international Rotary clubs. Christmas baskets for the poor.

Vocational Service Team

A group of Rotarians and/or non-Rotarians with a specific vocation go to another country to teach and provide service in their specialty e.g. educators, obstetrical or surgical medical personnel.

Matching Grants

A worthwhile project overseas is identified - money from the club is matched by District and by Rotary International to quadruple the effect. 2015-2016 water project for schools.

Scholarship through District or Global grants.

Overseas study with a service component.

Superbuild

A partnership with District 5300 and "Project Corozon" To build homes in Mexico where Rotary is building a community and "changing lives".
